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1. Call for motions for the England Conference of LMCs

- o Other



2. Beds & Herts LMC Ltd Annual General Meeting – Wednesday 20th September 2023

We are pleased to announce that the Beds & Herts LMC Limited AGM will be held on Wednesday 20th September 2023 at Putteridge Bury Conference Centre, Hitchin Road, Beds, LU2 8LE at **2pm**.

Alongside taking care of the constitutional elements of the business, such as agreeing the accounts, auditors, budget and any amendments to levies, there will then be an opportunity hear about the key priority areas of work the LMC has been doing over the last year, such as:-

• The Future of the Partnership Model – work we have done to identify the strengths of the Partnership Model and how it can continue in the future;



- Goldilocks & the Three Partnerships Paper & the Partnership Change Project Primary
 Research analysis to identify key characteristics and considerations for joining, changing or
 leaving Partnerships;
- Business Fundamentals Programme The LMC's modular training course for aspiring/new partners including the 8 key competencies for partners;
- The LMC's Partner Competency Based Self-Assessment Tool The LMC's newly developed tool for existing partners (and partnerships) to be able to assess themselves against the 8 key competencies for partners;
- Equality, Diversity & Inclusion (EDI) review The LMC's programme to monitor if our Committees are properly reflective of our membership, and then to help us centre EDI considerations in everything we do;
- Statistical analysis of data to support General Practice There is now a lot of national data published about what is happening in practices. Here are some insights into what the national data actually says and how it doesn't necessarily support the line that ICBs and the NHS want to tell you.

3. Access to online records update

You will be aware that the government imposed contract changes this year which included an imposition of the roll out of prospective access to records.

The regulations (which set out what is to be incorporated into GMS/APMS contracts) were amended by the government to make it more favourable to their position in that they removed clauses that helped practices to opt out if the redaction software wasn't adequate or if the workload was too significant.

GPC England (GPCE) looked at making a legal challenge to this imposition and certain aspects that caused concern around data governance, patient safety and the practice role as data controllers. After external senior legal opinions were sought it was decided by the BMA that the chances of success in such a legal action were low and didn't justify the costs involved in such a case. This doesn't stop GPCE taking further steps and towards the end of July GPCE issued further challenges to the government around aspects of the programme.

GPCE had also committed to engage with the government over improvements that could occur in the coming months before the intended roll out date of the 31st October 2023. GPCE has already issued some guidance here on next steps practices can take to be prepared for the 31st October roll out date. GPCE has also promised to issue more guidance soon around how practices can approach this programme and the risks they perceive and the wider concerns they have.

The above was the situation as reported to LMCs at the end of July. The recent changes at GPCE might signal a change of approach by GPCE. We will keep practices informed of future communications from GPCE on this issue.

In the meantime we recommend that practices read the guidance <u>here</u> and make the appropriate preparations for the intended roll out date of the 31st October.

4. Responding to private healthcare requests

We have been getting quite a few questions about patients who have come back to their GP after seeing a private provider. GPC England has produced <u>this guidance</u>. This should help practices to understand what is, and what is not, covered by GMS in such situations and to reduce extra workload generated by requests from private providers.
